Télécom Paris has a strong ambition: to be an open, inclusive, and exemplary institution in the fight against all forms of violence, discrimination, and inequality.

This commitment involves all of us—students, teachers, faculty members, staff and student associations—in creating a campus environment where everyone feels respected, heard, and supported.

The progress already made encourages us to keep advancing our efforts to promote gender diversity, continue combating gender-based and sexual violence (GBSV), discrimination against LGBT+ individuals,

racism, and to foster respect for each person's uniqueness.

That is why Télécom Paris has implemented a concrete action plan, structured around six key areas. It includes, among other measures:

1. Awareness and training initiatives from the moment students arrive at the school, aimed at fostering a culture of respect and equality, led by Télécom Paris' "Respect and Equality" officers.

2. Student-led initiatives, driven with energy by the REC Club (Respect, Listening and Consent), which plays a central role in campus social and festive life.

3. Awareness initiatives for faculty and staff, including a charter, role-

playing workshops, and conferences.

4. A listening and support system to ensure that victims and witnesses of violence or discrimination are heard and provided with appropriate support.

5. Regular assessment of discrimination incidents within the school through surveys conducted among students and staff.

6. Initiatives to promote better inclusion of LGBT+ people.

Together, let's make our school a place of respect and openness.

THE LAW

Recognized by French law that gender-based and sexual violence are offences punishable through the Criminal Code.

RAPE

[French Criminal code article 222-23]

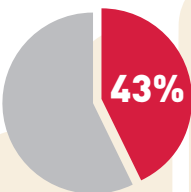
« Rape is an act of sexual penetration, of any kind, or any oral-genital act committed on the victim, or forced onto the perpetrator, by means of violence, constraint, threat, or surprise.»

› A Crime punishable by 15 years of imprisonment (20 years for aggravated rape)

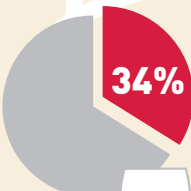

SEXUAL ASSAULT

[French Criminal Code, article 222-22]

« ...any sexual assault committed with violence, coercion, threat, or surprise”.*»

› Offence punishable by 5 years imprisonment and a €75,000 fine (7 years in prison and €100,000 fine for aggravated sexual assault).

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

[French Criminal Code, article 222-33]

I. «...imposing on a person, in a repeated manner, comments or behavior with sexual or sexist connotations that either infringe on the individual's dignity because of their degrading or humiliating nature, or create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive context.»

II. "...using any form of serious pressure, even if not repeated, with the real or apparent aim of obtaining an act of a sexual nature, whether this is sought for the benefit of the perpetrator or for a third party. »

› **Offence punishable by 2 years imprisonment and a €30,000 fine (3 years imprisonment and a €45,000 fine in case of aggravated sexual harassment).**

SEXUAL EXPOSURE

[French Criminal Code, article 222-32]

Exposing oneself or engaging in sexually explicit behavior in public.

› **A criminal offense punishable by 1 year in prison and a €15,000 fine**

SEXIST INSULT

[French Criminal Code, article 621-1]

«...consists of imposing on someone any remark or behavior of a sexual or sexist nature that either undermines their dignity through its degrading or humiliating character, or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment for them.»

› **An offense punishable by a €750 fine (€1,500 for aggravated cases and €3,000 in the event of repeat offenses).**

CYBERBULLYING AND CYBERSEXISM

[French Criminal Code, article 222-33]

Cyberbullying refers to online harassment through a public platform or private messaging on a social network. It aims to intimidate and humiliate the victim through insulting messages, mockery, threats, and more. When it involves sharing photos or videos with sexual or sexist content, it is referred to as cybersexism.

› **A criminal offense punishable by 2 years in prison and a €30,000 fine**

CONSENT? LET'S TALK ABOUT IT!

CONSENT MUST BE:

Explicit: Don't leave any room for doubt, ask and clearly express your desires and your limits.

Free and enlightened: Without coercion, pressure or threats, and with a clear mind (no alcohol, drugs, serious illnesses, etc.). You know what to expect, what you're getting into.

Specific: Saying yes to one practice does not imply consent to everything else. Ask again at every stage!

Reversible : a "yes" is never definitive; you're free to change your mind and stop a relationship at any time.

Informed: every partner needs to know if there is a risk of sexually transmitted infection (STI) or pregnancy.
Protect yourself!
